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
#### Performance Notes


- \* All players start at the same time.
- \* A whole note on the score represents a note to be played.
- \* The rhythm of that whole note is to be that of a bouncing ball from when it strikes the ground to when it stops moving. As natural as possible.
- \* The rhythm and dynamics should be similiar to this:



- \* Each beat should land sooner than the last one and be quieter, ending in a soft tremolo that fades out.
- \* Once a note fades out the player should move on to the next whole note.
- \* The piece should take approx. 3 minutes.
- \* The players are to ignore exact timing and play the rhythm by feel. Also they should ignore the other players.
- \* The disparity between the players rhythms will provide the melodic interest.
- \* When the last player fades out his final 'f' the piece is finished.

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





